Online Appendix - Unweighted Response Counts and Percentages for Each Survey Question

Nurses in Washington State were required to complete an online survey with questions about their demographics, work characteristics and education history.

The tables below show unweighted responses, meaning they show the number of RNs who selected each response option for each question in the survey. These should not be confused with the weighted estimates presented in the Full Report at

Notes:

- 1) Sex, age and mailing address were collected for all nurses when they initiated or renewed their nursing license and not presented in the survey response tables below.
- 2) Number of employment positions, number of hours worked, employment setting, employment specialty, position title(s) and employment ZIP code questions were only asked of nurses who indicated they were employed as a nurse. All other questions were asked of all nurses taking the survey.
