Online Appendix – Unweighted Response Counts and Percentages for Each Survey Question

Licensed practical nurses (LPNs) in Washington State were required to complete an online survey with questions about their demographics, work characteristics and education history.

The tables below show unweighted responses, meaning they show the number of LPNs who selected each response option for each question in the survey. These should not be confused with the weighted estimates presented in the Full Report at:

Notes:

- 1) Sex, age and mailing address were collected for all nurses when they initiated or renewed their nursing license and are not presented in the survey response tables below.
- 2) The number of employment positions, the number of hours worked, employment setting, employment specialty, position title(s) and employment ZIP Code questions were asked only of LPNs who indicated they were employed in nursing. All other questions were asked of all LPNs taking the survey.
- 3) Table cells with responses from less than 10 LPNs were suppressed and percentages were not calculated (NC) for these categories to protect the identity of nurses and to indicate that these estimates may be unreliable due to the small number of survey responses. In some of the tables, additional cells with 10 or more responses were also suppressed to prevent back-calculation of the cells with fewer than 10 responses.
