
Washington State Data Snapshot | Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioners (ARNPs)


The advanced registered nurse practitioner (ARNP) license category in Washington includes:

- Certified registered nurse anesthetists (CRNAs).
- Certified nurse midwives (CNMs).
- Nurse practitioners (NPs).
- Clinical nurse specialists (CNSs).

In Washington State, ARNPs must hold an active registered nurse license in addition to an ARNP license. The following Washington statistics were calculated based on data from the ARNP license files, which contain licensee name, mailing address, birthdate, and gender.




