Bozeman Creek Family Health (BCFH) is an independent, privately-owned Family Medicine clinic founded in 2005 and located in downtown Bozeman, Montana. BCFH has 4 board-certified Family Physicians, 3 nurse practitioners, and one physician assistant. BCFH prioritizes patient-centered care and values the diversity of views and lifestyles of all patients.

A full range of Family Medicine services is available through the clinic, including treatment of acute concerns, well and sick child visits, vaccinations, prenatal obstetric care, wellness exams for all adults, mental health care and sports medicine. We are equipped to perform dermatological procedures, gynecological procedures, vasectomies, and other outpatient procedures.

Community

Bozeman is the gem of Big Sky Country, bustling with activities for all seasons. Winter brings powder to the peaks at Bridger Bowl Ski Area and nearby Big Sky Ski Resort, while the spring brings high waters and thrilling rafting on the Gallatin River. Summer is splendid for

backpacking the Gallatin Divide, and fall colors bring nearby Yellowstone Park to life as the wildlife come out to mate. The city's cultural scene thrives with annual events like the American Indian Pow Wow and the rodeo.

Bozeman has a population of approximately 47,000 people, making it the fourth largest city in Montana. It is a very active community surrounded by mountains with an abundance of recreational activities, including skiing, mountain biking, kayaking, fishing, and hiking. Bozeman is also home to Montana State University.

Patients

Clinical:

Students will typically work with one primary preceptor each week in the clinic. Visits encompass the full scope of Family Practice, including acute care, chronic care, well child, sports medicine, mental health and annual wellness exams for all ages. Students will be involved in procedures including: skin biopsy, colposcopy, IUD placement and removal, endometrial biopsy, and vasectomy.

Housing

3 bedroom 2 bath condo/apartment will be shared amongst the UWSOM students rotating in the four Bozeman clerkships (FM, PEDS, OB, MED). Housing will not be suitable for families unless prior approval is obtained. Pets are not allowed. Student will need to provide their own vehicle to this rotation, but public transportation is available and biking is possible in the warmer months. The coop grocery store is .7 miles. Safeway and Town and Country grocery store are 1.3 miles. Walmart is .7 miles away. Streamline bus stop is 1 block north on 5th St. Bozeman hospital is 2.5 miles.

Other

Weekends are typically free for students to enjoy leisure time. Bozeman is surrounded by extensive public lands and is also home to Montana State University, so there is a wide range of cultural and outdoor activities available year-round. In town and close to town students can access trails for hiking, biking, and running. Bridger Bowl ski resort is 30 minutes from downtown. Yellowstone National Park is 1.5 hours away.
