COMMUNITY

Nampa has a small-town feel. Located just west of Boise, Nampa has hidden charm as well as options for BIG city fun. Residents in the Treasure Valley enjoy the four seasons and quick access to the wilderness. Whether you hunt, fish, hike, camp, mountain bike, or mountain climb, the Sawtooth Mountains to the north and the Owyhee's to the south give you ample opportunity to play. When the snow falls, skiing, snowshoeing, snowmobile riding and other winter sports abound. The wineries, river parks, and the shore of Lake Lowell offer beautiful places to picnic. The Civic Center for concerts and the Warhawk museum for education and military history provide fun experiences for the whole family. There are several colleges in the area for interested family members. Idaho's capitol, Boise, is 20 minutes away and offers excellent entertainment, recreation, and shopping. OVERALL GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

- Function as a clinician-student at the Family Medicine Health Clinic - Nampa.
- Learn critical aspects of outpatient care of patients of all ages, specifically understanding and participating in the transitions of care to and from the hospital and other care organizations.
- Develop abilities in assessing and caring for acutely and chronically ill patients.
- Work as a team member within a PCMH and learn the roles and structure of that team.

ROTATION LOGISTICS

Family Medicine Residency of Idaho (FMRI) Nampa Program offers Family Medicine clerkships and sub-internships for medical students. Students interested in Family Medicine clerkships or sub-internships at FMRI Nampa must first meet the criteria below:

Third Year FM Medical Students:

- FMRI Nampa will accept third year FM clerkship medical students from the University Of Washington School Of Medicine, the University Of Utah School Of Medicine, the Pacific Northwest University College of Osteopathic Medicine or the Idaho College of Osteopathic Medicine.
- FMRI Nampa is currently not accepting third year medical students from schools not listed above.

Fourth Year FM Medical Students:

- FMRI Nampa will accept fourth-year medical students for a combined in-patient and out-patient sub-internship from the University Of Washington School Of Medicine, University Of Utah School Of Medicine, the Pacific Northwest University College of Osteopathic Medicine and the Idaho College of Osteopathic Medicine on a space available basis after items 1-3 below have been received, reviewed and approved. All University of Washington School of Medicine and Idaho College of Osteopathic Medicine students, please contact you Clerkship Coordinator to check availability.
 - Part I of the USMLE or COMLEX exam scores.
 - Copy of medical school transcripts.
 - Completed copy of the Medical Student Questionnaire
- Due to hospital credentialing, sub-internship rotation must first be approved by FMRI Nampa AND THEN apply through the University of Washington Visiting Student Clinical Elective Program (VSLO**). Please check the University of Washington rotation dates before applying. Requested rotation dates should fall within the rotation guidelines and ideally be for four weeks. Registration through VSLO should be started at least ten weeks prior to your desired rotation date and the final confirmation of your rotation from the University of Washington received at least four weeks prior to your rotation start date in order to be eligible to start your rotation.
- Medical students applying for an outpatient only rotation will not have to register through the VSLO. Again, these are approved on a case by case basis.

Your rotation will be a combination of inpatient and outpatient experiences. You will work with a variety of attendings and residents but you will have one primary preceptor with whom you will meet to get formal feedback and overall grades at the end of the rotation. You will work in a small unopposed hospital that is part of a larger supportive hospital system. The size allows you to become involved in all aspects of a patient's care both in and out of the hospital. You will also have the opportunity to work in both of our clinic sites, and with some of our specialty clinics as able due to scheduling. These include our OB, Gyn, Sports medicine, and OMT clinics—with more on the way! Here in Nampa, our faculty members are passionate about training excellent Family Medicine physicians by creating a trusting environment for our patients in a well-established teaching health center/FQHC, while also prioritizing resident and student satisfaction and well-being.

***Please note: Neither a vehicle nor housing are provided. Housing and transportation are the responsibility of the student.**

OUTPATIENT CLINIC

Basics

INPATIENT HOSPITAL

Basics

- Hospital days start at 7 AM.
- There is a cafeteria located on the north side of the first floor.
- Physician lounge is on the second floor.
- To get to the FMRI call room, please use the South entrance and take the elevators up to the 3rd floor.
- L&D is located on the third floor. Med/Surg unit is on the second floor. Telemetry and ICU are on the first floor. The ED is located on the first floor in the South wing.

TEACHING AND DIDACTICS

The student will participate in weekly half-day conferences. These typically take place on Fridays from 12:30p-5:00pm.

ONBOARDING PROCESS

1. FMRI External Learner Packet /COVID Attestation
2. Color copy of your photo ID (i.e. driver's license, passport, etc.)
3. Headshot picture (This could be your school photo or any other professional type photo)
4. CV
5. Documentation of HIPAA and any other training.
6. Letter of Good Standing (Please make sure it includes proof of liability Insurance coverage)
7. Immunization Records to include COVID-19, Hep B, MMR, Tdap and Varicella (or immunity)
8. Proof of negative TB Test within last year
9. Current flu vaccination (During Oct-March)
10. Short Personal Bio (A few sentences about yourself, where you're from, school, hobbies/interests you have, etc. This is usually shared with our staff so they are familiar with you when they see you around.)

PLEASE NOTE: COVID-19 vaccination is required for our rotation and sponsoring hospital system. We do comply with local protections for religious or medical exemptions. Please manage this process through your school prior to submitting an application to rotate with us.
