Your doctor's office and the University of Washington are working together on a project called Colonoscopy Outreach for Rural Communities (CORC). CORC will explore ways to help patients get screening for colon cancer with a colonoscopy. It will also provide extra support to patients to get screened. Your doctor shared your contact information with the CORC team so you could learn about this opportunity. We are writing to invite you to take part in this research study.

What will happen if I take part in CORC?

Everyone who takes part in CORC will get help completing colonoscopy. Participants will be randomly split into two groups.

Group A (50%)
will get an educational handout about
colonoscopy

Group B (50%)
will have a patient navigator call and
help them get their colonoscopy

Participants will complete one survey when joining CORC. They will receive a \$20 gift card after finishing the survey as a thank you. Some people will also be invited to take part in an interview after they get their colonoscopy.

Whether or not you take part in CORC is up to you. If you do not want to take part, it will not affect the medical care you receive now or in the future.

What should I do next?
