

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Antibiotic Update for Primary Care

Paul Pottinger, MD, provided an Antibiotic Update for Primary Care to kick things off in the morning. His presentation informed us of the appropriate selection of the common antibiotics used in the outpatient setting, reviewed appropriate antibiotics for the prevention and treatment of special populations, and taught us to screen patients for penicillin allergy and delable them when appropriate.

Clinical Teaching Strategies

Amanda Kost, MD, gave an overview of Clinical Teaching Strategies for FM Clerkship students. She offered two strategies for success:

- **One-Minute Preceptor:** includes the 5 basic skills of Get a Commitment, Probe for Supporting Evidence, Reinforce What Was Done Well, Give Guidance About Errors/Omissions, and Teach a General Principle
- **ARCH Model:** include the 4 basic skills of Allow/ Ask for self-assessment, Reinforce what is being done well, Confirm what needs correction or improvement, and Help the learner with an action plan for improvement and coach as needed.

Participants partnered up for some role playing to practice and solidify the skills.



Reimbursement and Finance

Scott Bailey and Rachel Summers from the School of Medicine Financial Office reviewed the Clerkship stipend and Clerkship reimbursement process. As a reminder, sites are paid an administrative fee of \$3,000 per student to disperse as is appropriate for each site. The school will also pay Clerkship faculty for travel-related costs, such as the cost of travel to the FM End of Quarter meetings.
