Dillon

Dillon Montana is located in the Rocky Mountains, in Beaverhead County and offers all the amenities of rural living with unparalleled natural beauty. Its population is 3,976 (2021) and sits at an elevation of 5,096 feet. Dillon is situated in a sweeping valley into which the Ruby, Big Hole, and Beaverhead Rivers drain. The Beaverhead River is a blue-ribbon trout stream that's a favorite for expert fly fishermen. Beaverhead County is the largest cattle producing county in Montana and is home to many



generational ranches. There are several museums in Dillon devoted to preserving local history, with over 50 buildings that line Main Street recalling Montana's formative years. Major employers include: The United States Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, Barrett Minerals, and Barrett Hospital & HealthCare. Dillon is also home to the University of Montana Western, a college of about 1,500 students from all over the world.

Dillon Montana is situated in a valley that is 5,200 feet above sea level with the Continental Divide on three sides. As Montana weather goes, we tend to be in the banana belt with less snow and milder temps. It does get very windy in Dillon, but the views are spectacular.
